THE SITUATION IN THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES OF CROATIA

Report of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee)

I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd meeting, on 22 September 1995, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fiftieth session the item entitled "The situation in the occupied territories of Croatia" and to allocate it to the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee).

2. The Fourth Committee considered the item at its 13th and 25th meetings, on 31 October and 30 November 1995 (see A/C.4/50/SR.13 and 25).

3. The Committee had before it the following documents:

(a) Report of the Secretary-General submitted in pursuance of General Assembly resolution 49/43 (A/50/648);

(b) Letter dated 25 October 1995 from the Permanent Representative of Croatia to the United Nations addressed to the Chairman of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) (A/C.4/50/6).

II. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSAL

4. At its 25th meeting, on 30 November, the Fourth Committee, at the request of Croatia, 1/ decided to defer consideration of the item until the fifty-first session of the General Assembly and recommended its inclusion in the provisional agenda of that session (see para. 5).

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE SPECIAL POLITICAL AND
DECOLONIZATION COMMITTEE (FOURTH COMMITTEE)

5. The Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

The General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee), decides to defer consideration of the item entitled "The situation in the occupied territories of Croatia" and to include it in the provisional agenda of its fifty-first session.
